

THE GENEROSITY CLIMB

Generosity is like climbing—it requires intentionality, strength, courage, wisdom, and perseverance. Each step of the climb is a challenge that builds our strength and takes us forward to the summit.

Where are you on your generosity climb?

INITIAL GIVER

An Initial Giver is someone choosing to give for the first time in response to God's Word. They activate and deepen their faith by stepping out to trust God and their church-leaders.

CONSISTENT GIVER

A Consistent Giver has committed to the discipline of regular giving as scripture instructs. This is often someone who decides to set up recurring giving and experiences the joy of giving regularly and faithfully.

SURRENDERED GIVER

A Surrendered Giver understands that Jesus gave His all, and their every provision is from Him. They respond by joyfully trusting and honoring Jesus with 100% of their resources—diligently stewarding it all for Him. Their kingdom giving determines their spending and saving, not vice versa.

PROPORTIONAL GIVER

A Proportional Giver embraces kingdom priorities by intentionally giving a percentage (or tithe) of the first fruits of their income in joyful obedience to God's Word.

ETERNAL GIVER

An Eternal Giver gives sacrificially, seeking ways to convert their worldly assets and income into kingdom treasure. They see beyond short-term comforts and seek opportunities to sacrificially honor God with all that He has provided, leaving behind a lasting, eternal legacy of generosity.






