

We will invest in our A2 Communities (Acts 2:42-47) by adding Area Shepherds, care resources, rich discipleship options, and great opportunities to grow and serve our communities together.



OPTIMIZE WESTSIDERS' HEALTH TO BLESS OTHERS

We will also faithfully steward our resources, reducing existing long-term mortgage debt, adding parking capacity at Speedway, and enhancing our facilities for discipleship.

We will expand our gospel-centered outreach, care, and healthy empowerment of hurting people in our neighborhoods, city, and world. This includes generous Community and Global Impact investments, Foster and Adoption ministry, city partnerships, and more.





Jesus demonstrated his unique approach to ministry by meeting people's spiritual and practical needs:

Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and healing every disease and sickness among the people. News about him spread all over Syria, and people brought to him all who were ill with various diseases, those suffering severe pain, the demon-possessed, those having seizures, and the paralyzed; and he healed them.

- Matthew 4:23-24

In Jesus' day, the common illnesses were blindness, leprosy, lameness, and demon possession. Many of today's illnesses are emotional, relational, and spiritual: depression, anxiety, divorce, relational breakdown, addiction, abuse, and trauma.

Through our Westside Family Care Center we will wrap God's family around hurting families with gospel-centered care that promotes relational and spiritual wholeness. Just as in Jesus' day, news about God's healing love will spread and others will be drawn to Him.

Westside is fully committed to teaching God's word, proclaiming the good news of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and sharing healing ministry to hurting individuals and families.



Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved."

"...Saul spent several days with the disciples in Damascus. At once he began to preach in the synagogues that Jesus is the Son of God. All those who heard him were astonished and asked, "Isn't he the man who raised havoc in Jerusalem among those who call on this name?..."

At Antioch: Now those who had been scattered by the persecution that broke out when Stephen was killed traveled as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus and Antioch, spreading the word only among Jews. Some of them, however, men from Cyprus and Cyrene, went to Antioch and began to speak to Greeks also, telling them the good news about the Lord Jesus. The Lord's hand was with them, and a great number of people believed and turned to the Lord.

At Antioch: Knowing that a famine was coming to the Roman world. "The disciples, as each one was able, decided to provide help for the brothers and sisters living in Judea. This they did, sending their gift to the elders by Barnabas and Saul."



Pray to open your time together.

Pray as a group in gratitude for what God has done and is doing through our all-church Commitment Weekend for Unshakeable. Pray for anyone who has yet to make their commitment and pray for God to strengthen us as a church and as individuals over these next two years.

Today's Scripture:

From Miletus, Paul sent to Ephesus for the elders of the church. When they arrived, he said to them: "You know how I lived the whole time I was with you, from the first day I came into the province of Asia. I served the Lord with great humility and with tears and in the midst of severe testing by the plots of my Jewish opponents. You know that I have not hesitated to preach anything that would be helpful to you but have taught you publicly and from house to house. I have declared to both Jews and Greeks that they must turn to God in repentance and have faith in our Lord Jesus.

"And now, compelled by the Spirit, I am going to Jerusalem, not knowing what will happen to me there. I only know that in every city the Holy Spirit warns me that prison and hardships are facing me. However, I consider my life worth nothing to me; my only aim is to finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me—the task of testifying to the good news of God's grace.

"Now I know that none of you among whom I have gone about preaching the kingdom will ever see me again....

- Acts 2:17-25

"Now I commit you to God and to the word of his grace, which can build you up and give you an inheritance among all those who are sanctified. I have not coveted anyone's silver or gold or clothing. You yourselves know that these hands of mine have supplied my own needs and the needs of my companions. In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'"
